



You can choose ChatGPT and DALL-E for layouts and illustrations. My preference is ChatGPT 4.0 as it can due illustrations and text and can even be directed to make pictures in sequence for the story starter. The process will be demonstrated here soon.



Step 2: Brainstorm Together

Sit down with your child and ask fun questions to spark ideas:

- What type of story do you want to create?
- Who will be the hero?
- What magical places will they visit?

Use the Kids do Books AI guide book for prompts you can customize for your story. You can always "tweak" the prompt to guide the AI to rewrite and reshape to your heart's content.


Use AI to suggest additional characters, plot twists, or settings. For example, ask ChatGPT: "Can you give us five ideas for a fantasy story featuring a young wizard and a talking owl?"



Step 3: Write the First Draft

Take turns with your child creating sentences or paragraphs. Use AI to fill in gaps or refine ideas. You can ask it to:

- Expand on a scene.
- Simplify complex ideas for younger audiences.
- Provide creative dialogue suggestions.





Step 4: Add Illustrations

Or, if you choose you can use ChatGPT 4.0 but that is not a free AI version and there is a monthly fee. Right now I pay \$ 20.00/month. This may be a good choice since it does illustrations along with the story.

Also good if your family is going to make story time a regular feature, a weekly happening. That way adults and kids can make and even sell your books as a family start up business.





Section 3: Maintenance

Once you've created your first story, you might wonder how to keep the momentum going. Here are some tips:

Create a routine: Dedicate a weekly "storytime session" for writing and brainstorming.

Explore different genres: Experiment with mystery, adventure, or sci-fi to keep things fresh.

Rotate roles: Let your child be the "AI operator" or lead storyteller to empower them further.
